

## Does the structure of the federal court system allow it to administer justice effectively?

Most of the cases the Supreme Court agrees to hear today involve constitutional issues. Before the Judiciary Act of 1925, however, *anyone* had the right to appeal to the Supreme Court if a case involved more than \$1,000 or a conviction of a capital crime. In addition, before 1891 Supreme Court justices rode circuit, or traveled around a large region to hear cases. The federal court system was restructured to reduce the number of cases heard by the Supreme Court.

Some justices were forced to ride hundreds of miles each year in trains and horse-drawn coaches over poorly kept roads. In 1839, for example, the nine justices traveled nearly 30,000 miles riding circuit. Justice Stephen J. Field's Pacific circuit took him by sail to the West Coast, traveling by rail across Panama. After the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1869, he at least was able to make the journey by rail. . . . The 1890s and the new century witnessed a spurt in regulatory legislation at the state and federal levels, and the Court's docket once again exploded. It grew from 723 cases in 1900 to 1,116 in 1910.
